# The way to get the fiber from Kheuapiad vine

1. Kheuapiad in the forest



2. Scrape Kheuapiad



8. Kheuapiad yarn after twisting



3. Strip the Kheuapiad barks off and take out the fiber by knife



4. Dry



5. Kheuapiad fiber



6. Split the dry fiber thin and twist it with leg and hand



7. Fiber after twisting
